


# VOLUNTEER WITH US

Action for Conservation (AFC) is a UK youth environmental action charity that inspires and empowers young people aged 12-24, from diverse backgrounds across the UK, to become the next generation of environmental leaders.

To us, being a 'conservationist' or 'environmentalist' doesn't just mean following a career as a field biologist or a campaigner. We believe that a passion for nature can flow through anyone's life, whatever their day job. We inspire today's young people to a long-term belief in the wonder of the natural world, which will shape their dreams and actions however their life turns out.

# **PROGRAMMES**

### WildED

An education programme for secondary schools and youth groups. Young people learn about environmental issues and solutions. Groups then develop their own action projects on environmental problems that they feel need to be tackled in their communities and schools. Previous projects include creating vegetable gardens and beach clean-up events.





## **Residential Summer Camps**

Taking place in UK National Parks, like the Pembrokeshire Coast National Park, young people spend an all-inclusive five days immersed in nature. They explore habitats, take part in hands-on conservation activities with partners like the National Trust, see incredible wildlife during bird ringing, moth trapping and bat walk sessions and make friends for life.

### **Ambassador Programme**

After camp, young people are invited to join our year-long Ambassador Programme. They take part in webinars and action days with partners and experts and are supported to pursue independent projects, from leading food-growing clubs to designing and delivering sustainable fashion workshops. They also access and participate in meaningful decision-making opportunities with other organisations.





### The Penpont Project

Taking place in the heart of the Bannau Brycheiniog National Park in Wales, this is the largest intergenerational nature restoration project in the world. Guided by a Youth Leadership Group of 12 to 18-year-olds, young people work in partnership with local farmers, landowners, and conservationists to restore habitats and explore innovative farming and forestry approaches for humans and non-humans alike.



# WHY VOLUNTEER?

You'll be joining a young, mission-driven team who truly love what they do. Working with young people is always rewarding, sometimes challenging and never boring, and you'll get to experience first-hand the positive impact that your contribution has.

## Some of the benefits of volunteering at Action for Conservation :

- A thorough induction and training package specific to your role.
- Access to training, skill-sharing workshops, networking events and career support and opportunities, depending on your role, interests and development goals.
- Easy shift sign-up and scheduling options.
- Opportunities to develop new skills and knowledge such as public speaking, youth engagement, group facilitation, practical conservation, and others.
- Invitations to volunteer celebrations, socials and a recognition event.
- Seeing the impact of what you do, as you transform young people's lives.
- Reasonable travel costs and food are provided for most roles.



# VOLUNTEER ROLES

#### Choosing a volunteer role:

Read through the roles below. In your volunteer application choose <u>one</u> role that best reflects your interests and suitability. If you're interested in different roles, there is space to indicate this on your application and it may be possible to expand your responsibilities once you start volunteering.

## YOUTH ENGAGEMENT VOLUNTEER

#### Apply for this role if you are:

- 18+ years-old
- An early career professional or University student or recent graduate
- Interested in developing skills and knowledge in youth work and nature
- · Living in London, Manchester or Bristol
- Fun, energetic and empathetic
- Able to attend at least 1 workshops or activities per month, noting that typically:
  - WildED takes place during week days
  - Ambassador activities take place on weekends
  - Activity times vary and are not always consistent, so require some flexibility

#### What will you do?

- Support us in delivering engaging workshops and outdoor action days with young people across our programmes
- Provide support and feedback for young people's projects and ideas
- Contribute your knowledge and skills to our programmes and develop new ones of your own






## **CAMP LEADER**

#### Apply for this role if you are:

- 18+ years-old
- An early career professional or University student or recent graduate
- Interested in developing skills and knowledge in youth work and nature
- Fun, energetic and empathetic
- Familiar with AFC's work already, either through a previous volunteer role or personal connection to the charity
- Able to attend at least 3 days of a residential summer camp in July or August (please visit <u>our website</u> for this summer's camp dates).

#### What will you do?

- Support us in delivering engaging sessions with young people on camp
- Support with group management, health and safety and logistics
- · Help with cooking and cleaning
- Lead games and contribute to the fun



## PENPONT COMMUNITY VOLUNTEER

#### Apply for this role if you are:

- Any age, though young people under the age of 18 must be accompanied to activities by a parent/carer
- Positive, energetic and willing to learn on the go
- Physically able to walk across varied terrain (activity-dependent)
- Able to independently travel to Penpont (LD3 8EU), located near Brecon, Wales

#### What will you do?

- Carry out practical restoration activities at Penpont as our seasonal action plan unfolds
- Connect with the land and community through collective action for the land, art, games and feasts

## **KNOWLEDGE MENTOR**

#### Apply for this role if you are:

- 18+ years-old
- Knowledgable or have specialised skills in a particular area related to our work, for example, pond creation, bushcraft, food growing, environmental justice, meadow creation, species monitoring etc.
- Keen to share your experience and experience with young people
- Available to respond to ad-hoc opportunities related to your particular knowledge or skills area as they arise

#### What will you do?

- Lead/co-lead 'expert' sessions across our programmes on your particular knowledge or skill area
- Provide advice and guidance to young people and members of our team related to your particular knowledge or skills area
- Support young people to implement projects related to your particular knowledge or skill area



### PHOTOGRAPHY VOLUNTEER

#### Apply for this role if you are:

- 18+ years-old
- Interested in photography or videography
- Experienced photographer/videographer either professional, graduate or self-taught as part of own interest
- Interested in youth work and nature
- · Fun, high energy and engaging
- Owning your own camera is a bonus!

#### What will you do?

- Capture and edit photographs across our programmatic work
- Capture video content from across our programmatic work
- Ad hoc video editing for social media

# OUR COMMITMENT TO DIVERSITY

Diversity is one of our core values as an organisation and we are committed to creating an inclusive working environment where diversity is valued and there is equality of opportunity. We also recognise that the climate and ecological crisis disproportionately impacts minority and/or marginalised communities – yet these voices are largely underrepresented in the sector.

Currently, the environmental sector is the second least diverse in the UK, with just 4.8% of employees from ethnic minority backgrounds. If the environmental movement is to succeed in creating a greener future that supports society as a whole, we need diverse voices at the heart of our programmes. We, therefore, encourage people from demographics that are currently underrepresented in the environmental movement to apply.







# KEEPING YOUNG PEOPLE SAFE

We are committed to ensuring that robust child safeguarding practices are seen as the norm so that safeguarding becomes everybody's responsibility. We expect all volunteers to protect the young people we work with from harm and abide by our Child Safeguarding Policy. Volunteers will be required to provide two references as part of the application process and may be asked to complete an enhanced Disclosure and Barring Service (DBS) check, depending on the nature of their role.
